CSIU/STEAM³S Involvement:

STEAM³S is a Federal 21st Century Community Learning Center grant program funded by the Pennsylvania Department of Education and administered by the Central Susquehanna Intermediate Unit 16. STEAM³S staff will provide high quality and engaging curriculum throughout the camp. Students involved with STEAM³S should enroll with Mr. Mike Tanney, site coordinator.

Bucknell University Involvement:

Bucknell University athletic department, coaches and athletes will provide fun and meaningful activities during most camp days. A complete schedule of activities will be available closer to the start of camp.

Dates:

The summer camp will be held over three weeks. Week #1 will be from Monday, June 14TH to Thursday, June 17th. Week #2 will be held from Monday, June 21st to Thursday, June 24th. Week #3 will be held from Monday, June 28th to Thursday, July 1st.

Hours:

The Kaupas camp will be held from 8:30am to 12:00pm Monday-Thursday.

Lunch:

Students will be able to participate in the free summer lunch program held at the Elementary School. Adult lunches will be available at a cost of \$2. Lunch will be served for camp students at 12:00 pm. Morning snacks will also be provided.

Attendance:

Each student will be supervised by a STEAM³S instructional staff member. Daily program attendance is highly encouraged. It has been proven that consistent attendance in summer programs leads to improved academic and social behaviors during the regular school year. It is understood that students will have obligations throughout the summer. If you anticipate that your child will be absent, please send a note or contact the Site Coordinator, Mr. Mike Tanney (570-246-9321). Any student who is consistently absent without a note from their parent or guardian will be removed from the camp roster. Three absences without permission may result in removal from camp roster. Please do not call the school district to report absences.

Clearances:

All Kaupas Camp and STEAM³S staff members are required to possess the following clearances as matter of safety for our students:

- Pennsylvania State Police Criminal History Check
- Pennsylvania Department of Human Services Child Abuse History Clearance
- FBI Report (Fingerprinting)

Transportation: STEAM³S will provide bus transportation for student arrival. Students will be picked up from their regular school year stop as stated on the STEAM³S registration form. Parents/Guardians will be notified of place and time. The Mount Carmel Area School District will provide student transportation home. *(Students attending the Kaupas Camp not enrolled through STEAM³S may need to find their own transportation. For more information on transportation please contact Jolene Scicchitano)*

Curriculum:

The goal of STEAM³S is to spark and sustain interest, engagement, and achievement in STEM content; and evidence based programs and activities to help students meet state and local academic achievement standards. Accordingly, this project will implement a variety of robust evidence-based STEM activities.

Each four-hour day will be shared between STEAM³S academic curriculum and Bucknell University athletic department activities.

Discipline:

All students are expected to adhere to Kaupas Camp rules and expectations, and the Mount Carmel Area School District Code of Conduct. Administration and staff reserve the right to remove a student from the camp at any time due to discipline or behavior issues. The camp will enforce a “three strikes and you’re out” policy. Any behavior that involves fighting, weapons, vandalism, or drugs/alcohol will result in immediate termination.

Technology:

The Mount Carmel Area School District will provide the use of the Internet & Email. Students will abide by the Computer Use And User Agreement contract. Students can check the account information section on the Mount Carmel Area Web Page (<http://www.mca.k12.pa.us>).

Nurse and Medication:

All medications should be given outside of camp hours. Most medications, even those scheduled for three times per day, can usually be given outside camp hours. The camp will not provide cough, cold, flu medication, allergy medications, or antibiotics.

School policy prohibits students from carrying ANY medication that is prescribed or purchased “over the counter.” Students requiring oral medication during camp hours must have their parent or guardian come to the school to administer the medication.

Field Trips:

As part of the Kaupas Camp program, students may be taken on field trips requiring bus transportation. Such trips are made only with permission of parents/guardians. When such trips are taken or being planned, permission slips will be sent home to be signed by the parents/guardians. Written permission must be secured from parents/guardians of students to participate in field trips.

COVID-19

MCA will strictly follow all CDC and Pennsylvania Department of Health COVID-19 related guidance during our summer 2021 camp. Parents are expected to conduct daily morning screenings before sending their child to the Kaupas camp. Parents are expected to keep their children home if sick or exhibiting any COVID-19 related symptoms.
